24 hours of Science

May 8 and 9, 2015

Québec - May 7, 2015 – The Musée Royal 22^e Régiment, in collaboration with *24 hours of Science*, invites the population to discover night vision and thermal imaging.

The Museum will be participating in *24 hours of Science* for the first time, under the theme Shining a Light on Science. During this activity, the Musée Royal 22^e Régiment will show you what you cannot see.

The public will discover night vision and thermal imaging by using military devices such as:

- night vision goggles;
- infrared lasers;
- scopes;
- thermal devices.

The public will learn how we see, how our vision differs from nocturnal animals, how night vision and thermal imaging work and will see an exhibit on lighting devices from the 20th century.
